

SUMMER READING PROGRAM RULES

SummerQuest

Read 10 genres and do 10 activities (divided into 5 pairs to spell QUEST). Earn 25 tickets for each of the first four SummerQuest pairs completed. Complete the fifth pair to spell QUEST and earn a prize book. Come into the library to pick up your tickets and choose a prize book!

- Ages 3-12 only.
- Each child may only complete the SummerQuest once per summer.
- SummerQuest progress must be logged in the child's account at reading.schlowlibrary.org
- You can log individual books and activities as you complete them, but the genres must be completed with their assigned pair before you can earn the bonus tickets. For example, the Adventure book and Animal book and both of their activities must all be complete to earn the bonus tickets for that SummerQuest activity pair.
- After you complete one of the QUEST letters, we invite you to show off what you've made, learned, or created by sending us an email at children@schlowlibrary.org with a picture of your activities.
- Listening to an audiobook counts as reading a book.
- SummerQuests must be completed and logged online by Wednesday, August 17, 2022 to receive the bonus tickets and prize book. Tickets must be picked up by August 17 to be included in the final prize drawing on Thursday, August 18, 2022.
- Prize books must be picked up by Saturday, September 10, 2022.
- If your family is not comfortable coming into the library, please email us at children@schlowlibrary.org and we will help you choose your prize book from home instead.



Daily Reading

Go above and beyond by reading every day! Earn a ticket for every day you read a minimum of 20 minutes!

- Log onto reading.schlowlibrary.org to keep track of your reading days in the Reading Log.
- Read 21 days in a row and receive 25 bonus tickets!
- Listening to an audiobook counts as reading a book.
- Check in at the library to receive your tickets and place them in the prize drawing boxes of your choice.
- Maximum of 1 ticket check-in per day, please!
- Ticket check-ins end 30 minutes before the Library closes each day.
- Prize drawings will take place on the following Thursdays: June 16, July 7, July 28, and August 18.
- The last day to check in for tickets will be Wednesday, August 17. The final prize drawing will be held on Thursday, August 18 before the Library opens.

Weekly Pop-Up Challenges

PROGRAM INSTRUCTIONS

1. How to Register on reading.schlowlibrary.org

If your child already has an account on this site:

- If your child participated in Summer Reading last year or a past book club, their account still works!
- Go to **reading.schlowlibrary.org** and click the green LOGIN button.
- Enter your child's username and password and click the blue Log In button.
- Let us know if you need our help! We can remind you of your child's username and/or change their password for you. Just email us at children@schlowlibrary.org
- Click the blue REGISTER button below the Summer Reading 2022 Ages 3 to 12 image.
- Enter the required information, then click the green REGISTER button.

If you are making a **reading.schlowlibrary.org** account for the first time:

- Go to **reading.schlowlibrary.org** and click the green REGISTER button.
- Enter your child's name and age, and your email address. (Please enter an email address you check regularly as we will use these to contact you regarding Summer Reading. Please do not use SCASD student emails.)
- Choose a password (minimum 6 characters)
- Check the confirmation box, and click the blue Sign Up button.
- An orange WELCOME message will let you know that you registered your child successfully! Their username will display here, and will also be sent to the email address you used to register.
- Click the blue REGISTER button below the Summer Reading 2022 - Ages 3 to 12 image.
- Enter the required information, then click the green REGISTER button.

2. How to Log Your Daily Reading and Earn Prize Drawing Tickets

- Go to reading.schlowlibrary.org
- Click the green LOGIN button in the upper right corner, and log in with the username and password you picked when you registered.
- Click "Enter" below the Summer Reading 2022 - Ages 3 to 12 image
- Select the "Reading Log" tab.
- Click on the day(s) you want to log. The box will turn green and a "+" will appear.
- Once you have selected all the days you want to log, click "Submit" in the green bar at the top of the page.
- To see how many tickets you've earned so far, click on the Prizes tab. Your current total will be listed in the "Tickets" box.
- Read 21 days in a row to earn 25 bonus tickets! You can do this up to three times this summer. Your bonus tickets will be tallied automatically and added into your Tickets total after you log the appropriate amount of days.

3. How to Complete the SummerQuest

The genres MUST be completed with their assigned pairs before you can earn bonus tickets. For example, the Adventure book and Animal book and both of their activities must all be complete and entered on reading.schlowlibrary.org before you will be awarded the tickets for that SummerQuest activity pair.

Read 10 genres and do 10 activities (divided into 5 pairs to spell QUEST). Earn 20 tickets for each of the first four SummerQuest pairs completed. Complete the fifth pair to spell QUEST and earn a prize book. Come into the library to pick up your tickets and choose a prize book!

- Help your child choose the book they want to read for the genre and one activity to complete.
- Activities are listed in this calendar on page 5 as well as in the SummerQuest section of the Quests tab at reading.schlowlibrary.org
- For each genre, choose one activity from the three options.
- Now your child is ready to read their book and complete their activity!
- When you're ready to log your book or activity, go to reading.schlowlibrary.org
- Click the green "LOGIN" button in the upper right corner, and log in with the username and password you picked when you registered.
- Click "Enter" below the Summer Reading 2022 - Ages 3 to 12 image
- Click on the "Quests" tab.
- Click the green "Your SummerQuest" button in the SummerQuest box.
- Find the genre your child is working on.
 Enter the title of the book they read and choose the activity they completed from the drop-down menu. Doing these two things at different times? That's okay! Save and come back later if you need to.
- Click the blue "Update" button.
- Repeat the previous two steps to enter all genre and activity pairs as you complete them over the summer.
- When your child has completed the two books and two activities in one of the QUEST letters, they will earn 20 tickets! These tickets will be automatically added to the grand total in the Tickets box on the Prizes tab.
- Repeat these steps until you have finished the word QUEST to earn 20 tickets for the first four letters and a prize book for the fifth letter. Come into the library to pick up your tickets and choose a prize book! If your family is not comfortable coming in, please email us at children@schlowlibrary.org and we will help you choose your book from home instead.


